




Birds of Kamloops by Rick Howie RP Bio


This checklist was created in 2004 prior to the taxonomic and name changes and the order of species as presented in the most recent American Ornithologists Union checklist for birds of North America. Since the Kamloops checklist was issued, 5 species have been added. They are Cackling Goose, Broadwinged Hawk, Lesser Black-backed Gull, Eurasian Collared Dove and Eastern Phoebe. Convincing details or photographs were provided for the new species. Broad-tailed Hummingbird was added to the hypothetical list.

Hypothetical Species

The following species have been reported but with insufficient details to confirm the sighting. However they are listed here in case the author incorrectly evaluated the observations.

Smew, Whooping Crane, Upland Sandpiper, White-headed Woodpecker, Hutton's Vireo, Bewick's Wren, LeConte's Sparrow.

Exotic Species

The following species have been observed but are undoubtedly escapes from captivity or were intentional introductions that have not established breeding populations.

Mute Swan, Mandarin Duck, Wild Turkey, California Quail, Northern Bobwhite, Ringed Turtle Dove.

Birdwatching Hotspots

These are a few locations favoured by birdwatchers in this area. A topographic or good road map should allow you to find these spots.

Tranquille Wildlife Management Area, Paul Creek drainage, Rose Hill -Knutsford area, Greenstone Mountain, the lake chain along Hwy. 5A to Merritt, Lindley Creek Road west of Merritt, Douglas Plateau, Beaver Ranch Flats wetland project on Guichon Ranch along Hwy. 5A & Lac du Bois Provincial Park. The many logging roads into the plateau area north of Kamloops can be very good as can the drive to Chase along the north side of the South Thompson River, especially during the winter.

Birding Etiquette

There are large ranches, private holdings and logging operations throughout the area. Please respect property, leave cattle gates as you find them and seek permission to visit private lands. Heed warning signs on logging roads and travel with care. Pull well off to the side and do not park on blind curves when stopping.

Birdwatching Dates of Interest

Special activities organized by the Kamloops Naturalists Club are open to the public, so watch newspapers for specific dates. Guided trips - April to mid-July, September - October Annual swan & eagle count - mid - January along South Thompson River Christmas Bird Count - Dec. 15- 30 period March 1 - early Robins are back & first Bluebirds may arrive, owls nesting March 15 - first swallows should be back, Blackbirds active in marshes April 18-25 - peak of Sandhill Crane migration through Knutsford Mid-August - southbound migration of songbirds in full swing Mid-October - arrival of winter visitors such as swans, Bohemian Waxwings

Without healthy grasslands, special birds like these may vanish forever.
